- **3.** Expository essays/Position papers should be structured logically and may follow the pattern: title, abstract, introduction, main body, conclusion, recommendation, and references.
- **4.** The manuscript should normally conform to the style of the 7th edition of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA).
- **5.** It should not exceed a maximum of 12 pages, inclusive of the title page and the references list. It should include a cover page containing the title of the manuscript, the name(s), affiliation(s), phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of the author(s).
- **6.** An Abstract of between 150 to 200 words (single-line spacing) should follow the title closely on this page and should be followed by three to five keywords for indexing purposes.
- **7.** Manuscripts should be formatted as MS Word document using Times New Roman characters (12-point font size). It should be double line spacing while the margins should be one inch on all sides except the left side with 1.5 inches.
- **8.** Tables and figures should be marked with Arabic numerals and should not have vertical lines. All figures, diagrams, and charts should be presented in compliance with 7<sup>th</sup> edition APA styles.
